Moana Ave Slip – Roading Update

Work towards reopening Moana Ave has been progressing, with investigations by Geotechnical Engineers resulting in a recommendation for debris fencing.

This fencing was ordered pre-Christmas and is expected to arrive in New Zealand mid-March. Council will be installing the catch fencing along the eastern side of Moana Ave. It will run from the driveway of 134 Moana Ave, extending 70 metres along Moana Ave towards the roundabout. This fence consists of steel posts, steel mesh and tensioned cables that will be anchored into the ground. This will help protect road users and houses below from falling rocks.

The type of fencing planned is similar to that used along SH1 following the Kaikoura earthquake, as pictured below:



To safely and efficiently install the fencing, Moana Ave will need to be closed between Bisley Ave and Princes Drive. This is scheduled to occur between 27 March 2023 and 12 May 2023 (subject to the product arriving).

Residents within the closure will have access. Note those properties currently north of the shipping containers will have access from Princes Drive. Those Properties within the worksite

(where the current shipping containers are located) will have managed access from either end of Moana Ave. All other road users will be prohibited from travelling through this closure.

Attached you will find Council's standard road closure notification and feedback form. Please let us know if you have any special access requirements or concerns about this work.

We thank you for your patience as we assess this complex geotechnical problem, and as we work to reopen Moana Ave to two lanes of traffic.
