Tuku mai, Tuku atu Sharing of stories

Learning about Nelson's rich and diverse cultural history is an important part of understanding our shared stories, our identity and our people. It is an opportunity to celebrate who we are, where we come from and where we are going as a community.

This year, Nelson City Council updated the name of the Nelson Heritage Festival to 'Tuku 21 Whakatū Heritage Month'. 'Tuku' in te reo Māori means 'to transfer' or 'share', and reflects the intentions of our event - to share and learn about our rich and diverse stories that may encourage and support greater understanding of our community.



Once again, with assistance from Council funding, individuals and community groups have put forward an array of exciting events, which celebrate and highlight Whakatū Nelson's collective story and I would like to take this opportunity to thank these groups and volunteers for their enthusiasm, commitment, and investment in time and effort.

Tuku 21 Whakatū Heritage Month offers something for everyone and there is much to learn about Whakatū Nelson. On behalf of Nelson City Council, we hope you and your family, friends and work colleagues are able to embrace some of the activities contained in this programme, that may enrich your understanding and appreciation of our city by immersing yourself in tales from our community.

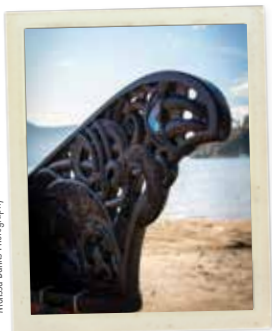

Nineteen photographic portraits of NZ nuclear test veterans taken in their own homes around NZ. All took part in Operation Grapple, a nuclear testing programme in the Pacific in 1957-58. The portraits show these veterans, who they are and where they are now, just over 60 years later. The images are accompanied by their stories, told in their own words, of their time at Operation Grapple. 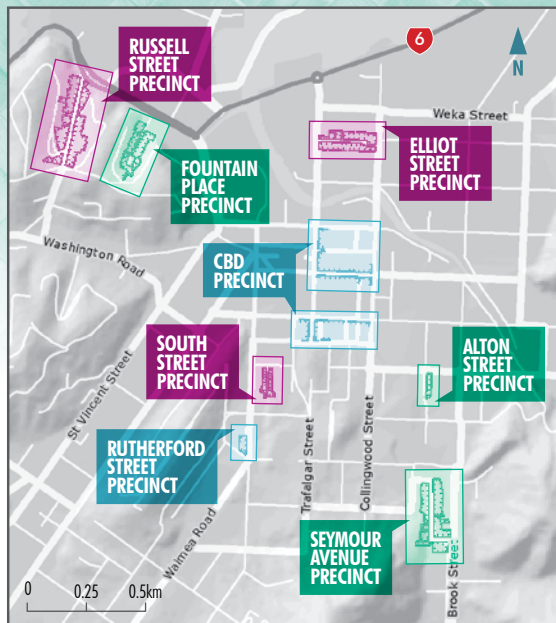

Formerly Nelson Heritage Festival, the new name for the month of events followed discussions with iwi, who have gifted the name “Tuku” meaning “to share” or “exchange”, in te reo Māori. The name is an expression of our diverse and unique stories, histories and heritage, and reflects the value of bi-culturalism within the context of Aotearoa New Zealand.

A new logo has also been adopted, featuring raranga, or a traditional woven design. The purple and green strands of the weave represent the partnership of Māori and New Zealand European settlers and the blue and orange represent other significant and diverse cultural groups who have settled in our region. All contribute to our collective stories and unique history.
